The opening line of last year's report said, 'Greetings from Morocco'. Like the AGM, our plans were cancelled and neither happened due to the turmoil created by the Coronavirus Pandemic.

We were locked out of the School until August 2020 during which time the position of Acting Principal changed from Craig Lynch to Kate Wilson. Craig was well respected by both the Society and the Scholarship Foundation and had continued the excellent relations we had established with Kath Ward and Rod Beresford. During lockdown, most of our contact was with Reception and we thank Amanda (Mandy) Bradford and Bernice Mullan for their communications and effort. During this time, Mandy managed various Kentian responsibilities, including retrieval of student records. All tasks were completed efficiently, and we are extremely grateful for that.

On return, the Thursday morning group continued their work in the archives, capably lead by Pat Sanders and well supported by Vicki Duball and Paul de Laeter. A special thanks to these three.

One highlight of the year was an enjoyable, end of the year, Combined Committee Luncheon catered for by the Year 11 Hospitality students. We sincerely thank them for their excellent menu and service. The luncheon enabled us to thank some of the Foundation's major sponsors and staff who had supported both organisations over many years. Our special guests included Jean and Peter Stokes, Allan Stiles, Kath Ward, Craig Lynch and Mandy Bradford.

November 2020 began a somewhat distressing time for the Kentian Society with the proposed removal of student records from the archives by the Department. Some of these had been in Kentian care since the late 90s. Others were rescued from white ants from the dungeon, an unkept storage area, before being placed in the designated archive for conservation, after the School's 70th Anniversary (2010). Rod Beresford's vision and thirty-five (35) hard working Kentians are mainly responsible for what we have today.

KENTIAN ARCHIVES REPORT FOR 2020

2020 was an unusual year with the arrival of the Covid 19 virus. The Archive working group, which meets each Thursday during the school term, was only able to attend KSSHS on 22 days of the year. Unfortunately, we were not able to attend on 17 working days which was 43% of our year.

Hence, last year was not particularly productive for the KS Archive group. However, we were able to have our annual historical display as part of the Grade 7 orientation activities at the school. As usual, the Grade 7 students enthusiastically participated in our display of old typewriters, pens and ink writing, old cooking utensils, school books and uniforms. The visits to see our "dungeon" to observe how the materials are stored was very popular. The students also enjoyed hearing about the "old days" at KS from our senior members.

We are still replacing earlier catalogue sheets kept in lever arch files with the later version which has a more up-to-date format and this allows us to physically check items in the dungeon. There is still a list of tasks that need to be completed by our working group and this keeps us busy.

In February 2020 the Kentians had a visit, one Thursday morning, from Lyn Hancock, well known Australian-Canadian photojournalist, wildlife photographer on with wild-life and her many achievements.

In 1957 newly qualified Lyn (then Taylor) was appointed as specialist speech teacher to Kent Street Senior High School. One of her tasks was to record and assess the voices of every student. Her teaching, studies and travel eventually led her to Canada where she married a wildlife expert. She has written at least 20 books including *There's a Seal in my Sleeping Bag*, *Love Affair with a Cougar*, *There's a Raccoon in My Parka* and has won seven awards for her writings. Lyn still teaches, writes and presents inspirational lectures and workshops.

The Thursday working group is keen to have some younger Kentians to join us on Thursdays to help with our work. Our group has an average age of 75 years and we do need to train up some younger people to eventually take over the archive work. It is vital that we achieve this in the next year or so.

I would like to acknowledge the hard work, dedication and knowledge of our senior archivist, Pat Sanders, who has led the archiving effort for many years. Pat is now stepping down to be our Assistant Archivist and to guide us through the next period of time.

Sincere thanks must also go to Paul de Laeter who has become a reliable, keen and valuable participant in our work and without him it would be almost impossible to keep up with our tasks. Paul's efforts are valuable and greatly appreciated.

Finally, I must acknowledge the leadership of our President, Bill Prince, who is working tirelessly for the Kentian Society and for the benefit of our Kent St students.

In 2021 there will be 1 x \$1000, Year 11 Jock Bremner Science Scholarship, 5 x \$1000, Year 11 Scholarships (the Kentian Academic Scholarships, the Jean and Peter Stokes Creative Arts Scholarship, two Jean and Peter Stokes Educational Fund Scholarships ❶ and the Earth and Environmental Science Scholarship), 2 x \$500, Year 12 Vocational and Educational Training Scholarships ❷, 1 x \$250, Year 12 Lance Maschmedt Physics Scholarship and 8 x \$100 Year 7 Aspire Scholarships

Our current average interest rates, over the next 2 years is ~1.95%. Every \$10,000 received could provide another \$195 towards scholarships, bursaries and prizes that may be awarded in the name of the donor/s. We are diversifying the share portfolio to increase our earnings with income coming from dividends and franking credits. Unfortunately, Covid-19 is causing this income to be somewhat unpredictable.
